



School agreement of the Schönwerth-Realschule Amberg

This school agreement was drawn up jointly by students, parents and teachers of Schönwerth-Realschule in order to ensure respectful cooperation between all those involved in the school community.

1. order and cleanliness

Each student is responsible for his or her own space. He/she shares responsibility for order in the classrooms and on the school grounds. Order includes a clean blackboard, putting up the chairs at the end of the last lesson, and the correct disposal of trash.

Soiling must be removed by the end of each class. If a student repeatedly soils the room or in the case of severe soiling, janitorial services must be performed. In addition, disciplinary measures will be taken.

2. teaching duties

2.1 Missing deadlines

Teaching duties include keeping appointments on time. If a student repeatedly fails to meet this obligation, the teacher will take appropriate educational action.

2.2 Provision of teaching materials

At the beginning of each lesson, each student must have ready the complete teaching material for the corresponding subject. If this is repeatedly not the case, the teacher also takes appropriate educational measures.

2.3 Missing homework

Repeated absence of homework will result in educational measures such as extra work, notice, make-up work, etc. Missing homework must be reported to the teacher at the beginning of the lesson without being asked.

3. behavior

The school has a general educational mission. Therefore, all those involved in school life should demonstrate behaviors that are essential for living together in a large community: A sense of responsibility, mutual respect, respect, adherence to agreed upon boundaries that are binding for all.

3.1 Physical and mental violence

Any kind of violence, from name-calling to insults, threats to bullying (including cyberbullying), as well as right-wing or racist remarks, will be consistently punished with all sanctions available to the school.

3.2 Vandalism / wanton destruction

Objects that are destroyed wantonly must be replaced in any case. Such behavior will be followed by educational and disciplinary measures appropriate to the situation.

Unintentional and voluntarily reported damage must be financially compensated and will not result in any disciplinary action.

3.3 Appropriate behavior in class

Respectful interaction means striking the appropriate tone, adhering to the usual rules of conversation (We are a polite school!) and expressing this respect through one's posture (including body posture).

Disruptions endanger learning success and also represent antisocial behavior towards both fellow students and the teacher. Accordingly, all necessary educational and disciplinary measures, up to and including exclusion from class, may be considered as sanctions.

3.4 Punctuality

Self-inflicted tardiness disrupts the smooth flow of instruction and will therefore not be tolerated.

3.5 Mobile phones / digital data carriers

For school purposes, the use of tablets is also permitted outside of class. The school does not assume any liability for damage. The unauthorized use of smartphones remains prohibited on the entire school premises. Violation of this rule may result in educational or disciplinary action at the discretion of the teacher. During performance assessments, storage media such as cell phones or smartwatches that are switched on are considered to be underage.

3.6 Smoking and alcohol

Smoking and alcohol are strictly prohibited on the entire school premises. Violations will be punished at least with a reprimand.

3.7 Food and drink

Eating and drinking are not permitted during class. With regard to drinking, however, the individual teacher may decide on exceptions. Chewing gum is not permitted anywhere on school grounds.

3.8 Break regulation

In principle, breaks can be spent either indoors or outdoors. Students leave the classrooms at the start of break and go to the assigned indoor and outdoor lounge areas. Home break due to weather will be indicated by a double gong. At the sounding of the pre-break gong (9:45 a.m. and 11:28 a.m.) at the end of the break, students will proceed to the classrooms. The instructions of the supervising teachers and the break helpers must be followed.

4. clothing

Agreements on clothing should not restrict the individuality of the student, but it should be ensured that no one is frightened, offended or injured in their dignity by the clothing of another. For this reason, jump boots, accessories and belts with pointed rivets, razor blades, heavy chains and the like, as well as T-shirts with insulting and inhuman prints are prohibited.

Excessively revealing clothing is not appropriate for school as a place of learning. Baseball caps and other non-religious head coverings must be removed in the classrooms. In the event of violations, parents will be notified and, if necessary, further educational and disciplinary measures will be taken.

5. means of transportation

All two-wheelers must be pushed within the school grounds and secured in the bicycle garage. Skateboards and other means of transportation must also remain secured in the bicycle garage. In the area of the bus stops, bicycles and e-bikes are to be pushed between 1:00 and 1:15 p.m. for safety reasons.

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
